The Holy Spirit in the Bible

I. INTRODUCTION

- A. Ignorance exists about the person of the Holy Spirit.
- B. The Holy Spirit is not a ghost—He has all the characteristics of a person.
 - 1. He thinks (Acts 15:28); He speaks (Acts 1:16); He leads (Romans 8:14); and He can be grieved (Ephesians 4:30).
 - 2. He is sometimes described as the "Spirit of Christ" (Romans 8:9) or as the "Spirit of Jesus" (Acts 16:7).
- C. He is described in John 14:16 as the *parakletos*. (This Greek term is difficult to translate briefly, but it carries the idea of "one called alongside to help," "counselor," "comforter," or "encourager."
- D. One of His ministries is to reveal the Person of Christ and His teachings to believers (John 16:5-7, 12-15).

II. THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

- A. The Holy Spirit was involved in creation (Genesis 1:1-2; 2:7).
- B. He came upon particular people at particular times for specific tasks.
 - 1. He enabled Bezalel to excel in artistic craftsmanship (Exodus 31:1-5).
 - 2. He empowered Gideon for leadership (Judges 6:14-16, 34).
 - 3. He empowered Sampson to bring deliverance to the Israelites (Judges 15:14-15).
 - 4. He spoke through the Old Testament prophets (Nehemiah 9:30).
- C. God promised to do something new through the Holy Spirit in the New Testament.
 - 1. God made covenants with His people in the Old Testament.
 - 2. He promised to make a new covenant with His people that would be different.
 - from previous covenants (Jeremiah 31:31).
 - 3. He promised that the Holy Spirit would be given to all believers (Joel 2:28-29).
 - a. He would be given to all believers regardless of gender, age, or social status.
 - b. He would give believers a new ability to hear God.
 - c. He would be poured out on all believers in abundance.
 - 4. These promises in Joel were unfulfilled for hundreds of years.

III. THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

- A. A trumpet sounds for new activity of the Holy Spirit surrounding the birth of Jesus.
 - 1. John the Baptist is filled with the Holy Spirit while in his mother's womb (Luke 1:15).
 - 2. The Holy Spirit overshadows Mary at Jesus' conception (Luke 1:35).

- 3. Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, prophesies concerning Jesus (Luke 1:41).
- 4. Zechariah, filled with the Holy Spirit, prophesies about Jesus (Luke 1:67).
- 5. Simeon is given revelation by the Holy Spirit (Luke 2:25).
- 6. Note that in each instance there is a tangible expression of the activity of the Holy Spirit, whether in words or actions.
- B. John the Baptist links Jesus with the Holy Spirit (Luke 3:16).
 - 1. The Greek word translated "baptize" means to overwhelm or immerse.
 - 2. Jesus was filled with the Holy Spirit (Luke 3:22).
 - 3. After Jesus was filled with the Holy Spirit, He began His public ministry (Luke 4:1, 14, 18-19).
- C. Jesus predicted the Holy Spirit's abiding presence in the lives of New Testament believers.
 - 1. He promised that "rivers of living water"—representing the presence of the Holy Spirit—would flow from them (John 7:37-39).
 - 2. Jesus carefully prepared the disciples for His departure (John 14:8-21; 15:26-27; 16:5-7, 12-15).
 - 3. Jesus breathed on the disciples and imparted the Spirit to them (John 20:21-22).
 - 4. Jesus told the disciples to wait for the empowering of the Holy Spirit (Luke 24:49; Acts 1;4-5, 8).
- D. The Holy Spirit plays a prominent role in the Church.
 - 1. The believers were filled with the Holy Spirit at the beginning of the Church (Acts 2:2-4).
 - 2. The promise in Joel was fulfilled at the Church's beginning (Acts 2:17-21).
 - 3. Peter promised that believers will be indwelt by the Holy Spirit (2:38-39).
 - 4. The disciples are again filled with the Holy Spirit in a time of need (Acts 4:31).
 - 5. Several other instances of believers being filled with the Holy Spirit are recorded in the Book of Acts.
 - a. The Samaritan believers were filled (Acts 8:14-19).
 - b. The newly converted Saul (Apostle Paul) was filled (Acts 9:17).
 - c. The Gentile Cornelius and his household were filled (Acts 10:44-48).
 - d. The believers at Ephesus were filled (Acts 19:6).
 - 6. Paul admonishes believers to be continually filled with the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 5:18).
 - 7. The Holy Spirit ministers the love of God in the hearts of believers (Romans 5:5).
 - 8. The Spirit and the Bride invite Jesus to come again at the end of the Age (Revelation 22:17).
- E. Thus, the Holy Spirit is at work in the Bible from beginning to end.
